About the Scientific Symposium

The theme of the 2024 National Atmospheric Deposition Program (NADP) Scientific Symposium, "*Protecting the health of communities and ecosystems in a changing climate*", is intended to bring scientists, environmental policy professionals, natural resource managers, and advocacy groups together to advance the science and tools that are needed to effectively protect vulnerable populations and ecosystems.

NADP is a dynamic, long-term partnership of federal, state, tribal and local governmental agencies, educational institutions, private companies, and non-governmental organizations. NADP facilitates robust research on atmospheric monitoring and modeling to provide information on multipollutant source/receptor relationships, deposition effects on terrestrial and aquatic ecosystems, and biogeochemical cycling of elements.

Major topics to be discussed at the 2024 Scientific Symposium include:

- Protecting the Great Lakes and coastal ecosystems from air pollution
- Measuring emerging and toxic pollutants
- Characterizing cultural and environmental impacts of air pollution to Tribal lands
- Linking shifts in air quality, atmospheric deposition, and critical loads to climate-driven events
- Health and environmental changes driven by shifts to cleaner energy
- New tools to communicate air quality and atmospheric deposition results
- Sustaining long-term monitoring programs
